The talent was broad as well: 13 entrants received recognition, seven people received one or more blue ribbons, and three people received reserve champion awards.

very dedicated to the club's public garden project in Lyndale Park. Bob joined MGCM in 1989. He was co-chair of the Fragrance Garden project in 1996. He was a founding member of the Perennial Trial Garden project in 1997, and co-chaired the committee until 2001. He was a member of the Mixed Border Garden committee until in 2015, but did not rejoin the club due to his

inability to attend meetings. The following memories are from past and present members of the park garden committee.

Bob and I joined the club in the same year, so I knew him "all my life" as a club member. He was always interested in our work at Lyndale Park. Even when his knees and back no longer allowed him to do the physical work, he brought the donut holes and coffee.

Bob was always willing to have his garden on tours. His corner lot on Minnehaha Parkway was the most "personal" space I've ever seen -- filled with birdhouses, sculptures, lights and other structures that Bob and his wife Phyllis designed and constructed. We were sorry that they had to sell the house after Phyllis got ill. I drive past it often. The structures are still there, but the spirit is gone, of course. I miss it. I extend my condolences and best wishes to Phyllis and Bob's daughters. Rest well, Bob.

What I remember is Bob at the bench near the west end of the area we groomed. He would arrange his donut holes on the bench in the shade for our breaks.
